Arrival Confirmation

You must notify the University of your arrival on campus by completing the **online** <u>Arrival Confirmation</u> as soon as possible, and no later than 15 days after classes begin.

After a successful **online Arrival Confirmation**, you will:

 \checkmark finally be in lawful F-1 student status

Welcome to Cal!

All new and readmitted international students are required to report their Arrival to Berkeley International Office. We need this information to activate your student visa status at UC Berkeley

In order to activate your student visa status, you must

- 1. Report your arrival by uploading your most recent I-94 or I-797c to our system (you are about to do this!).
- 2. Report your current address and phone number in our system (separate CalCentral task)
- 3. You must also report your current address and phone number in the LOCAL fields in Cal Central.


In this form, we will collect information about your most recent arrival in the U.S. and confirm your visa status.

Local Address and Phone Reporting

Welcome to Cal!

All new and readmitted international students are required to report their current local addresss and phone number to Berkeley International Office. We need this information to activate your student visa status at UC Berkeley.

In order to activate your student visa status, you must

- 1. Report your current address and phone number in our system (you are about to do this!)
- 2. You must also report your current address and phone number in the LOCAL fields in Cal Central (we will show you how to do this!)
- 3. Upload your most recent I-94 to our system (this is another task in your Cal Central.)



What are the requirements of my visa?

- 1. Keep documents valid (not expired).
- 2. Update your Local Address in <u>CalCentral</u> immediately.
- 3. Enroll in <u>full-time</u> units.

Failure to maintain legal status will require your immediate departure from the U.S.





But, I entered the U.S. as a tourist.*

If you entered on a B-1/B-2 visa or the Visa Waiver Program (ESTA), you should not be enrolled in <u>full-time</u> units.

*Berkeley International Office always recommends you enroll as a full-time F-1 student. We cannot advise or assist you if you are not in F or J status.

How many units is full-time enrollment in summer?

- You must enroll <u>full-time</u> based on your first session/I-20 start date.
- Waitlisted courses do not count!
- Students may enroll in more than one session.

My start date at UC Berkeley Summer Sessions is:	Full-time Units Total	I-20 Start Date	I-20 End Date
Session A Only	5	5/28/2019	7/5/2019
Session A and B, C, or D	10	5/28/2019	8/16/2019
Sessions A and E Only	8	5/28/2019	8/16/2019
Session B	8	6/10/2019	8/16/2019
Session C	6	6/24/2019	8/16/2019
Session D	5	7/8/2019	8/16/2019
Session E Only	3	7/29/2019	8/16/2019

What are some examples?

Examples:		
I am enrolled in Session A only. My I-20 dates are 5/28/2019 - 7/5/2019.	My full-time enrollment is 5 units.	
I am enrolled in Session A and Session D. My I-20 dates are 5/28/2019 - 8/16/2019.	My full-time enrollment is 10 units.	
I am enrolled in Session C only. My I-20 dates are 6/24/2019 - 8/16/2019.	My full-time enrollment is 6 units.	
I am enrolled in Sessions C, D, and E. My I-20 dates are 6/24/2019 - 8/16/2019.	My full-time enrollment is 6 units.	

Can international students take online courses?

Yes, but you are limited in the number of online courses that count towards fulltime enrollment.

- 3 online units maximum can be counted toward full-time enrollment for Session A, B, C, or D only.
- 3 online units maximum can be counted toward full-time enrollment for any <u>combination</u> of Sessions A, B, C, D, and E.
- NO (ZERO) online units can be counted toward full-time enrollment for enrollment in Session E only.
