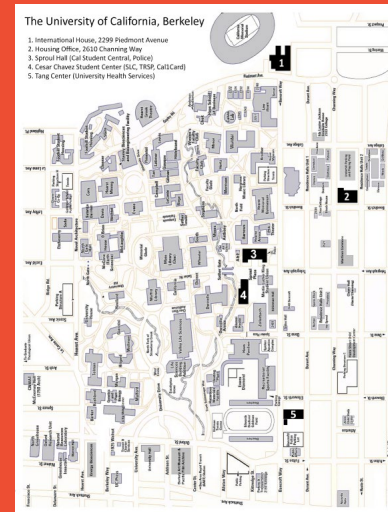
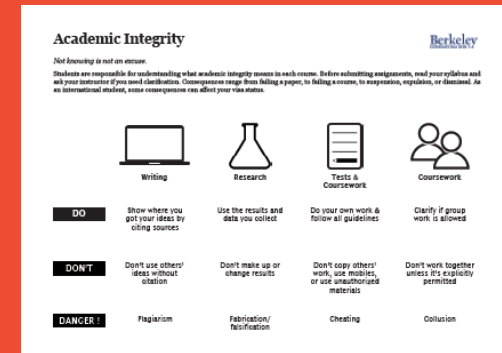

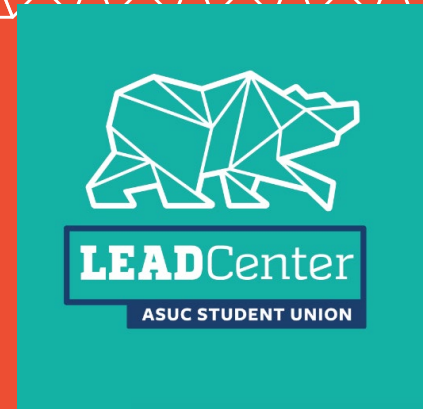
Student Learning Center (SLC)
