The Transfer Student Center provides assistance to students who transfer to Cal from other colleges or universities. The center is located in 100 Cesar E. Chavez Student Building.

Enroll in L&S 198

A one-unit transition course designed to assist first semester transfer students with making a successful transition to the research university. Students explore academic strategies, campus resources, and learn from one another expectations, explore about thriving at Cal.

Mentoring Program

This program connects first semester transfers with continuing transfers in the same major. Mentors meet with first semester transfers once or twice during the semester to discuss academic resources, and offer tips for navigating student life at Cal.

Workshops








Fall 2021

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Arrival Process




Release Date

- Do you qualify?
 - Currently in valid F 1 Status
 - Less than 5 months between programs
- Contact previous school's international office to transfer I 20 to UC Berkeley within 60 days of completing program of study or OPT
- BIO can only produce an I 20 after this date
- Deadline to transfer is August 21

If your release date is after August 21, please contact nif@berkeley.edu to discuss your case



Complete the NIF



- Login to Cal Central
 - Click on the NIF task to input information and upload funding documents
- 10 days processing time from completion

Visa & Travel

- Travel is not recommended! If you want to study in the US, best to remain in the US.
- Must renew passport if it will expire within 6 months, must renew visa if it is expired and you are outside the country.
- Since the SEVIS number will be the same, can use the same visa from previous school if it is still valid



Arrival Confirmation

Compléte U.S.Address/Phone Number task

- Temporary or short term addresses are accepted
- Also update information in Cal Central account in the Local Address field

Complete Arrival Confirmation task

Upload your I-94 (does not need to be recent)

Complete as soon as possible after arrival in the US, but no more than 30 days prior to your program start date.




